

## SHE'S THE QUEEN OF

Under his will, published in the Isle of Man yester-day. Mrs. Wilson inherits £1,500, the contents of the doctor's witches' museum in Castletown. Isle of Man, and all his "equipment, machinery and manuscripts relating to magic." They include a broomstick.
